Making any payments (cash, credit card or otherwise) towards any tour constitutes your unconditional acceptance of all the terms and conditions stated in this tour brochure. Catholic Travel Centre shall be referred to as CTC within this document.

DOCUMENTS: US citizens require a valid passport. Other nationalities please inquire with the appropriate embassies. Passports must be valid for six months beyond the tour's return date.

REGISTRATION AND DEPOSITS: A deposit of \$400 per person is required upon registration along with a signed copy of the registration form. Registrations cannot be taken by telephone. Registrations are processed in the order received by CTC. Balance of payment is due 90 days prior to departure. Late payment is subject to \$50 late fee. Late registrations (fewer than 90 days) must be accompanied by full payment by cashiers check only (including the optional passenger travel protection program payment, if applicable), plus a \$50 late fee and are subject to availability. CTC reserves the right to cancel reservations that are not paid in full 75 days prior to departure and to charge cancellation fees/penalties indicated below. A \$25 fee will be charged on all checks returned by our bank.

CHANGES IN INVOICING: Please note that after initial invoicing, any requests for change in form of payment (cash discount vs. standard base) or in package (air inclusive vs. "land only") are subject to a \$50 per person per change processing fee.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION FEES & REFUNDS: All cancellations must be received by CTC in writing via certified mail or facsimile. CTC will process your refund, minus a cancellation fee according to the following schedule:

- 1) \$150 if cancelled at least 150 days prior to the tour's departure date;

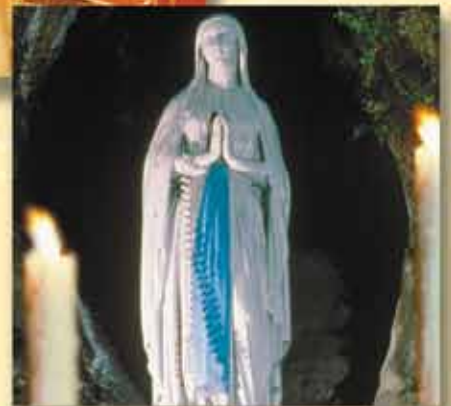
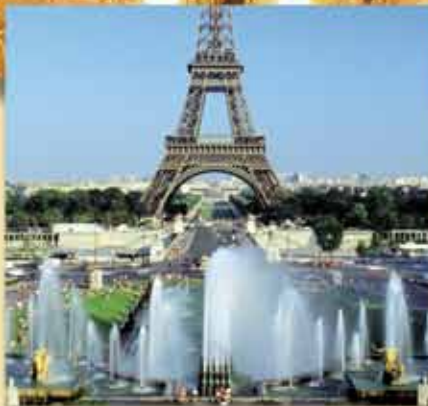
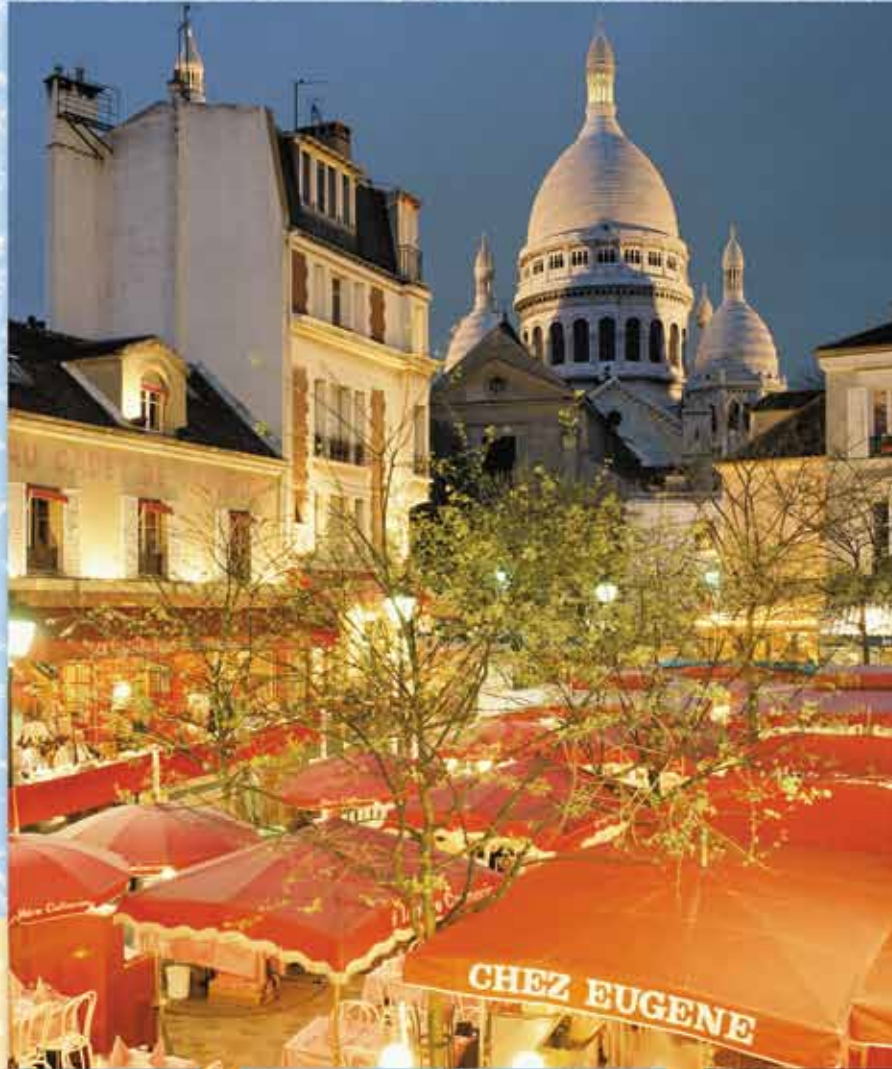

OUR DAILY ITINERARY

MON, SEP 19, DAY 1: DEPART THE USA: We depart en route to Paris, with complimentary meals and beverages served aloft.

TUE, SEP 20, DAY 2: ARRIVE PARIS / ROUEN / LISIEUX: We arrive in Paris and are met by our Catholic Travel Centre representative who will accompany us throughout our journey. Boarding our private motor coach, we transfer en route to Lisieux, stopping first in Rouen. Rouen is where Joan of Arc was imprisoned, tried, and burned on the market square by the English on May 30, 1431. We will see the white cross on the market square established on the place where she was burned. Joan of Arc was nineteen years old at the time of her death. St. Joan was canonized in 1920 by Pope Benedict XV.

We celebrate our opening Mass at the Cathedral of Notre Dame. After some time at leisure for lunch on our own, we continue to our hotel in Lisieux for dinner and the evening. (D)

WED, SEP 21, DAY 3: LISIEUX: EXCURSION TO NORMANDY BEACHES & BAYEUX: Today we make an excursion to view the Normandy beaches, where in 1944 the US and Britain launched their offensive against Hitler's forces in Germany. Utah and Omaha Beaches were the code names where some 9,000+ Americans gave their lives. We will visit the Normandy American Cemetery, commemorating all those who gave their life here, and elsewhere, in defense of freedom. We celebrate a memorial Mass at the Cemetery. We also visit Bayeux, a small, very well preserved historical city that is most famous for its Tapestry. It depicts various scenes from the Norman Conquest.

We visit as well Bayeux, a small, very well preserved historical city that is most famous for its Tapestry. It depicts various scenes from the Norman Conquest. After some time at leisure for lunch on our own, we return to Lisieux. Pope Pius X described St. Therese as 'the greatest saint of modern times.' St. Therese came to Lisieux with her family when she was aged 4 1/2 years old. Therese entered the Carmelite convent at age 15 and stayed until her death at age 24.

This afternoon we visit Les Buissonnets (the Lisieux family home), then proceed to the Basilica, the Carmelite

Convent Chapel, the reliquary of St. Therese, and the statue of the Virgin Mary that smiled at St. Therese. Dinner this evening is on our own. (B)

THU, SEP 22, DAY 4: LISIEUX / PARIS / LOURDES: This morning we celebrate Mass at the Basilica in Lisieux, then we transfer to Paris to board our afternoon high speed TGV train (2nd class tickets) to Lourdes.

More than four million pilgrims, come to Lourdes each year to bathe in the waters of the miraculous spring. In 1858, 14 year-old Bernadette Soubirous declared that the Virgin had appeared to her several times in the Cave of Massabielle and had said to her in the local patois, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Dinner and overnight are at our hotel in Lourdes. (B, D)

FRI, SEP 23, DAY 5: LOURDES: VISIT OF THE SHRINE: This morning we begin with Mass in the Basilica. We enjoy a walking tour "In the Footsteps of Bernadette." We visit the Cachot (the former jail cell where her impoverished family was lodged in one room at the time of the apparitions); the parish church; Fr. Peyramale's Presbytery; the Hospice and the Boly Mill.

At 4:30 in the afternoon we are welcome to participate in the Procession of the Blessed Sacrament and the Blessing of the Sick (subject to the local schedule). Dinner is served at our hotel tonight. After dinner at the hotel, we may return to the Sanctuary for the Rosary and Torchlight Procession, beginning about 8:30PM (subject to the local schedule). (B, D)

SAT, SEP 24, DAY 6: LOURDES / PARIS: Early this morning, we board our TGV train to Paris. Pack some wine, cheese and fruit for a picnic lunch on the train! Upon arrival, we enjoy a sightseeing tour of the city including the Champs Elysées, often called the most beautiful avenue in the world, the Arch of Triumph, Commissioned in 1806 by Napoleon, and the Eiffel Tower built for the International Exhibition of Paris of 1889. We continue on to our hotel for dinner and the evening. (B, D)

SUN, SEP 25, DAY 7: PARIS: NOTRE DAME, ST. CHAPELLE & LEISURE: This morning, after breakfast, we begin our day with a visit to Notre Dame Cathedral where we will join in the celebration of Mass.

On the spot where Notre Dame now stands, the Romans had once built a temple to Jupiter. In 1160, Bishop Maurice de Sully ordered the original Notre Dame known then as "the parish church of the kings of Europe" demolished. According to legend, the Bishop, who devoted his life and wealth to the construction, sketched his vision for the new cathedral in the dirt outside of the original church. Construction began in 1163, and was completed almost two hundred years later in 1345.

This majestic Gothic cathedral dominates the Seine and the Ile-de-la-Cité as well as the history of Paris. In 1431, Henry VI of England was crowned King of France in Notre Dame. In the 1500's, Henry IV of France and Mary I of Scotland were married in the Cathedral, and in 1944 the Te Deum Mass took place in the cathedral to celebrate the liberation of Paris. (According to some accounts the Mass was interrupted by gunfire from both the internal and external galleries.)

Next we visit Sainte-Chapelle ("Holy Chapel"). It was erected by Louis IX, King of France, to house the Crown of Thorns and a fragment of the True Cross, and other precious relics of the Passion. Louis had purchased these in 1239 from the Byzantine emperor Baldwin II, for the exorbitant sum of 135,000 livres (the chapel "only" cost 40,000 livres to build).

Two years later, more relics were brought from Byzantium. The most beautiful aspects of the chapel, and considered the best of their type in the world, are its stained glass and rose windows.

After our visit, the balance of the day is at leisure. Some of us may wish to go museum hopping or perhaps some shopping along the Champs Elysées.

We have our choice of some of the finest art museums in the world to choose from including the Louvre Museum, the world-famous museum that is home to such works of art as Leonardo da Vinci's Mona Lisa, as well as The Musée National Picasso situated in the heart of historic Paris, with its collection of several thousand works of Pablo Picasso. Dinner this evening is on our own. For those of us who wish to dine as a group, our escort will have some suggestions. (B)

MON, SEP 26, DAY 8: PARIS: VISIT OF THE CITY: MIRACULOUS MEDAL & EIFFEL TOWER: This morning we visit the Shrine of St. Catherine Laboure where the tradition of the Miraculous Medal began. Here we celebrate Mass. We visit as well the nearby sights of the repose of St. Louise de Marillac and St. Vincent de Paul, located in the Motherhouse of the Daughters of Charity.

Next, we visit the Eiffel Tower for the spectacular view from the second level. The balance of the day is at leisure. Dinner this evening is at our hotel. (B, D)

TUE, SEP 27, DAY 9: PARIS: EXCURSION TO CHARTRES: This morning, we travel to Chartres, former pagan sanctuary that was evangelized in the fourth century and became a pilgrimage site in 876. In this year, Charles the Bald gave the town the tunic that tradition says was worn by the Virgin Mary while giving birth to Jesus.

The 13th century cathedral dominates this idyllic town, surrounded by wheat fields. The church building itself is literally a Bible in stone, with over 4,000 sculpted figures and 5,000 figures in the stained glass windows, illustrating the Bible and lives of the Saints. Our tour escort will give us a guided tour of the Cathedral. Here we celebrate Mass. We return to Paris where the balance of the day is at leisure. Dinner this evening is on our own. (B)

WED, SEP 28, DAY 10: SACRE COEUR & MONTEMARTRE & LEISURE: This morning we will visit the picturesque and charming district of Montemartre. Far more than a just a district, this small village in the heart of the big city is an oasis that

has kept its soul of long ago, and its bohemian spirit. The mountain top is dominated by the Basilica of the Sacred Heart (Sacre Coeur). Here we celebrate the final Mass of our journey. After our visit of the Basilica, there will be time to stroll along the streets, admiring the work of the many artists following in the footsteps of Renoir, Cézanne, Toulouse-Lautrec and Picasso. Tonight we gather for a farewell dinner at a local restaurant. (B, D)

SEP 29, DAY 11: RETURN TO USA: This morning, after breakfast, we transfer to the Charles de Gaulle airport for our return flight to the USA. (B)

Note: While no changes are anticipated, there may be unforeseen occasions when certain alterations become necessary to this itinerary, either due to changes in airline schedules or for other reasons. All Masses are subject to local church schedules and substitution with alternate Mass sites if churches mentioned are not available.
